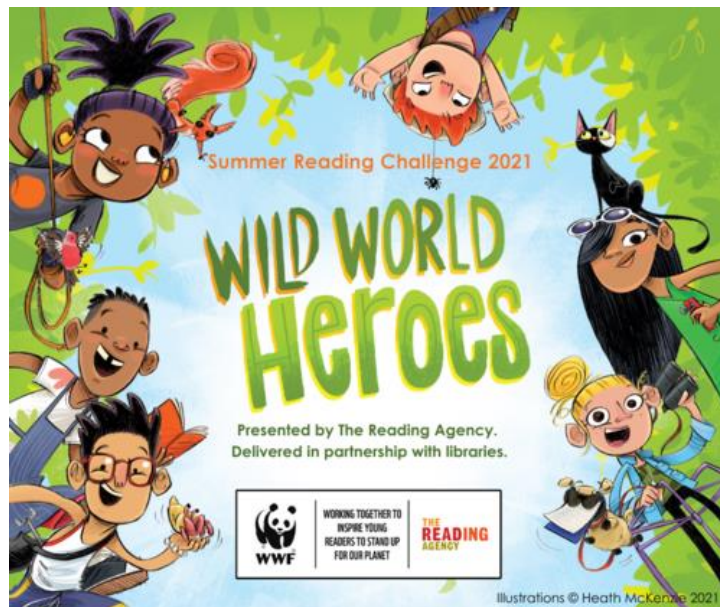


## Summer Reading Challenge

## Pupil Premium Funding and Free School Meals

- Have your circumstances changed?
- Have you been furloughed?
- Is your child moving into Year 3 in September?

Schools across the country are reporting an increase in Free School Meal applications due to the effects of lockdown and subsequent job losses and reduced working hours. If your circumstances have changed and you would like help in applying for Free School Meals, please speak to Mrs Fenner, Mrs Bailey or Mrs Keech in the school office in strict confidence. We would also like to reassure parents that Free School Meals information is dealt with sensitively and on a need to know basis.

Since the introduction of Universal Infant Free School Meals for Key Stage 1 pupils, there has been a significant reduction in the number of families applying for Pupil Premium/Free School Meals funding when their child starts school. If you have a child who is moving into Year 3, school meals will begin to be chargeable. ## Summer Events

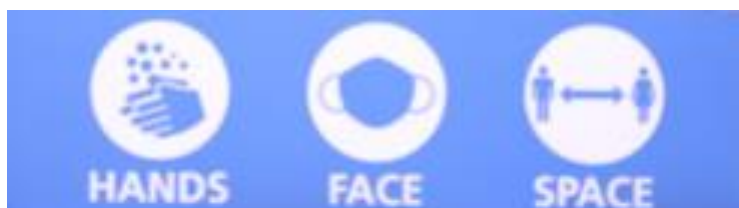
